

Differences between IViE and ToDI

IViE

- uses [0%] for [%] to indicate the absence of a tone, elsewhere also given as [Ø].
- uses H*L 0% for ToDI's H*L L% to describe a steep final fall. In ToDI, H*L % describes a shallow final fall ('incomplete fall'), for which IViE has no transcription.
- has a three-way contrast for initial boundary tones, %L, %0 and H%. ToDI has %L and %H. In ToDI 2.1, %HL was included to describe high initial pitch that falls towards the first pitch accent as opposed to staying high.
